Day by Day Itinerary

Day I Depart USA: Today we board our flights with meals and beverages served aloft

Day 2 Arrive London: Upon arrival in London you will be greeted by your Holy Land Travel Center representative and driver. Transfer to your hotel for a welcome dinner and overnight. Overnight: London (D)

Day 3 London: City Tour: Today we will visit St James Palace, which has been the setting for some of the most important events in Royal history, having been a residence of Kings and Queens of England for over 300 years until the reign of Queen Victoria. We will continue on to Buckingham Palace, the homestead of Queen Victoria and Queen Elizabeth II, Westminster Cathedral, Westminster Abbey, Parliament, Big and Westminster Bridge. We will go by boat along the Thames passing London Eye, Festival Hall, National Theatre, and Shakespeare Globe, to the Tower of London. Walk from Tower of London to St. Paul's Cathedral (approx. 30 min) then stop off at Blackfriars Pub before returning to the hotel. Lunch and afternoon free (shopping, Camden Towne, Hampstead Heath, National Shrine to the Holy Rosary) Overnight: London (B)

Day 4 Salisbury, Bath: Stonehenge, Roman Baths, Bath Abbey: Today after breakfast, we will depart to Stonehenge-the prehistoric monument on Salisbury Plain! On arrival, enjoy time to explore this atmospheric site at leisure and with the guide. Marvel at the gigantic stones and ponder how they were transported and raised here. Then, learn how and why Stonehenge was built – most scholars believe it formed a temple aligned to the sun – through archaeological exhibitions and experiences at the visitor center. Next, continue west to the 18th-century city of Bath. All honey-stoned townhouses, terraces and bridges, this UNESCOlisted city is one of England's crowning glories. Visit the original 2000-year-old Roman Baths and Georgian Pump Room with its natural mineral water. Free time to explore Bath with it's beautiful streets and handsome Georgian architecture such as the Royal Crescent, Bath Abbey and Pulteney Bridge that spans the Avon River.

Overnight: Bath (B)

Day 5 Cotswolds-Liverpool: Drive Through Cotswold Villages, Stratford Upon Avon, Penny Lane, Strawberry Fields: Today we drive north through the Cotswolds home to some of the most unspoilt, historic and famous towns and villages in England. We will take a stop in Stratford-upon-Avon, a medieval market town in England's West Midlands, is the 16th-century birthplace of William Shakespeare. Possibly the most famous writer in the English language, Shakespeare is known for his sonnets and plays such as 'Romeo and Juliet' and 'Hamlet'. The Royal Shakespeare Company performs his plays in the Royal Shakespeare Theatre and adjacent Swan Theatre on the banks of the River Avon. Next, we will travel to Liverpool to check out the areas where the Beatles rose to fame! We will then return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. Overnight: Liverpool (B, D)

Day 6 Liverpool To Glasgow: Windermere, Moffat: Today, travel along the shores of Windermere, the largest lake in England at the heart of the rolling hills of the picturesque Lake District, stopping for tea and fresh-baked scones at a local farmhouse. Continue towards the charming village of Grasmere, the 19th century home of the poet William Wordsworth. Next, cross into Scotland at the border town of Gretna Green, famous for its 'runaway' weddings, and past Moffat, known for its high-quality wool products. Arrive in Glasgow, for an orientation tour before returning to our hotel for dinner and overnight. Overnight: Glasgow (B, D)

Day 7 Glasgow: Central Station, Royal Exchange, Kelvingrove Art Gallery, Pollok House:

This morning's tour highlights "Glasgow Style," the city's distinct architecture of the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Though Glasgow has a rich medieval history, very few structures from that time survive; it is the Victorian-era buildings of red or blond sandstone with long lines that defne the city's historic built environment. Among the standout buildings we see: Glasgow Central Station, the Royal Exchange, Glasgow City Chambers, and Glasgow School of Art by Charles Rennie Mackintosh. We also visit Sir John W. Simpson's immensely popular Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum. Following our city tour, we visit Pollok House, ancestral home of the Maxwell clan and now a museum with the United Kingdom's greatest collection of Spanish art. Here a curator takes us on a privately guided tour of the Edwardian country house after we enjoy lunch in the award-winning restaurant. We return to our hotel mid-afternoon; the remainder of the day is at leisure. **Overnight: Glasgow (B, D)**

Day 8 Glasgow/ Fort William: Highlands, Loch Lomond, Trossachs National Park, Glencoe: We leave Glasgow this morning by motor coach, bound for the scenic Highlands, Scotland's sparsely populated historic northern region. We stop by the bonnie banks of Loch Lomond, Great Britain's largest lake and part of Loch Lomond and The Trossachs National Park. Our tour here includes a brief cruise on the island-dotted loch before continuing on to Glencoe, one of Scotland's most beautiful spots with deep valleys flanked by steep-sided mountains, rushing rivers, and dramatic waterfalls. Then, we travel on to Fort William, the Highlands' second largest settlement, arriving late afternoon. **Overnight: Fort Williams (B, D)**

Day 9 Fort William/Isle of Skye: Glenfinnan Monument, Ferry Ride, Armdale Castle and Gardens, Cuillin Hills, Eilean Donan Castle: We embark on a full-day excursion to the Isle of Skye, the largest of Scotland's Inner Hebrides known for its vivid history and stunning scenery. En route, we visit Glenfinnan Monument honoring "Bonnie Prince Charlie" for his leadership in the Jacobite Rising of 1745. Then we board a ferry for Armadale on the southern tip of Isle of Skye, where our touring begins with a visit to Armadale Castle and gardens. Next, we set out on a scenic drive through the imposing Cuillin Hills (or "Black Cuillin") to the fishing town of Portree. Here we enjoy lunch together at a local pub before continuing our tour of the island, known for its strong Gaelic infuence. Returning to the mainland via the Skye Bridge, we make a photo stop at iconic Eilean Donan Castle then dine tonight at our hotel.

Overnight: Fort William (B, D)

Day 10 Fort William/Loch Ness/Brora: Urquhart Castle, Culloden Moor Battle Site: We depart today for the Highlands, stopping en route at fabled Loch Ness. We drive the full 23-mile length of the lake best known for the unearthly creature alleged to live in its deep waters. We also visit the ruins of lakeside Urquhart Castle, one of Scotland's most popular attractions. Dating to at least the 13th century, the castle sits surrounded by water on three sides, giving it a once-formidable advantage in battle. Then we travel on to the historic Culloden Moor battle site. After time on our own to tour the museum here, we take a private guided tour of the hallowed grounds, site of the last battle of the Jacobite Rising in 1746. Early this evening we'll arrive in Brora, a quaint Highlands village and our home for the next two nights. Overnight: Brora (B, D)

Day Il Brora/Highlands: Pictish Trail, Tarbat, Tarbat Discovery Center, Dunrobin Castle: Our exploration of the Highlands continues on today's excursion along the Pictish Trail, sites connected with the late Iron Age/early Medieval Celtic people who once lived here. We learn about the ancient Picts at the acclaimed Tarbat Discovery Center, featuring excavated relics from the region. Continuing on, we visit striking Dunrobin Castle & Gardens, where we see a falconry demonstration. Then we drive along the scenic coastal road flanked by small farms with sheep, cows, and Shetland ponies before returning to our hotel. Overnight: Brora (B, D)

Day 12 St. Andrews/Edinburgh: Orientation Tour: Home of Scotland's oldest university (St. Andrews) and renowned as the home of golf, where the game has been played for some 600 years, delightful – and compact – St. Andrews measures just one mile across. This morning we embark on a walking tour of the medieval seaside town, followed by lunch together then free time to explore this picturesque medieval town on our own. Later this afternoon we continue on our way to Edinburgh. Dinner tonight is on our own in the Scottish capital, which boasts a robust culinary scene. Overnight: Edinburgh (B)

Day 13 Edinburgh: Old Town, New Town, Edinburgh Castle, Royal Palace, Royal Mile: Our morning tour of this stately city built on seven hills includes the 18thcentury Georgian "New Town," and the medieval "Old Town." We explore both areas – together, a UNESCO World Heritage site – on this morning's tour, including an inside visit to Edinburgh Castle, the symbolic heart of the country. Highlights here include the Great Hall, with its original hammer beam roof; the Honours (crown jewels) of Scotland; the Scottish National War Memorial; and the Royal Palace, the historic boulevard connecting Edinburgh Castle with the Palace of Holyrood House. We tour Holyrood, as it is called, and see where British royalty schemed and slept as we tour the State Apartments. The remainder of the day is at leisure, perhaps to visit the Royal Museum to learn about the country's cultural, industrial, and natural history. Tonight, we celebrate our Scotland sojourn over a farewell dinner at a local restaurant.

Overnight: Edinburgh (B, D)

Day 14 Depart Scotland: Today we bid farewell to Scotland today as you transfer to Edinburgh airport for our homebound flight to the US carrying with us memories and keepsakes that will last for a lifetime. (B)

Terms & Conditions

By making any payments (cash, credit card or otherwise) towards any tour constitutes your unconditional acceptance of all the terms and conditions stated in this brochure. Holy Land Travel Center shall be referred to as HLTC within this document.

DOCUMENTS: US citizens require a valid passport. Other nationalities please inquire with the appropriate embassies.

REGISTRATION AND DEPOSIT: Deposit of \$500 per person is required upon registration along with a signed copy of the registration form on or before. Registrations are processed in the order received by HLTC A second payment of \$1249 is required on or before 150 days prior to departure. A third payment of \$1000 is due 90 days prior to departure. Final payment is due 45 days prior to departure. Late payments are subject to \$50 late fee. HLTC reserves the right to cancel reservations that are not paid 30 days prior to departure and to apply applicable cancellation/penalties indicated below. No registrations can be made over the telephone.

INDIVIDUAL CANCELLATION FEES & REFUNDS: Upon cancellation of participation of tour by you, the registrant, for any reason, and only after HLTC receives your signed cancellation, HLTC will then refund your payment for services not received by you, minus applicable cancellation fees per person, according to the following schedule:

In addition to any cancellation fees specific to your tour found on your tour brochure, the following fees apply.

1) Minimum cancellation fee is \$350 from time of registration up to 120 days prior to the tour's departure date.

2) From 119 to 60 days prior to departure day, the cancellation fee is \$350 + 20% of total price.

3) From 59 days to 8 days prior to departure day, cancellation fee is 350 + 50% of total price.

4) From 7 days prior to departure day onward, no refund is possible.

TRAVEL PROTECTION: Travel insurance is recommended to help protect you and your trip investment against the unexpected. For your convenience, we offer travel protection. If you do not wish to purchase now, the plan can be purchased any time prior to departure date. If you chose to purchase outside of the time sensitive period outlined in the plan, you will not be eligible for time sensitive benefits. MEDICAL CONDITION: We endeavor to provide the highest level of service to all our passengers. Participants who require special assistance must be accompanied by a qualified helper who assumes total responsibility for the participants' well-being. This pilgrimage demands a lot of walking and can be strenuous. HLTC is not responsible for any medical conditions that occur prior to, during, or after the tour.

LAND TRANSPORTATION AND TRANSFERS: By private deluxe motor coach. ACCOMMODATIONS: Tour prices are per person, based on two persons sharing double or twin-bedded rooms with private bathroom with tub or shower. In the event that one does not sign up with a roommate and is not able to be paired with another traveler, there will be a single supplement charge to the account. Single rooms subject to availability and an additional cost of \$750.

MEALS: Meals in accordance with the itinerary. All beverages are extra.

TIPPING: Unless it is specified in the tour brochure, the price of the tour does not include tips and gratuities. Tipping is recommended to the tour guide and motor coach driver approximately \$6 and \$4 per person, respectively, per day to each: Hotel tips are approximately \$2 per day per person. Tips may be pre-collected before the pilgrimage for your convenience.

AIRLINE TICKETS AND ITINERARY LENGTH: Air transportation to/from your destination will be economy class aboard carriers utilizing non-refundable, nonamenable tickets. Preliminary international flight schedules are available 60 days prior to departure and may change before they are finalized. Therefore, if you book the domestic flight on your own, you will be responsible for changing your domestic flights and incurring any change fees that would be generated by this adjustment. We are not responsible for changes and delays in airline schedules and do not reimburse passengers for expenses resulting from such occurrences. Travelers making their own flight arrangements should not purchase non-refundable, nonchangeable tickets. We cannot guarantee the most direct routing to your final destination. If flight schedules change, we reserve the right to lengthen or shorten the itinerary accordingly, and if changes or flight schedules necessitate extra overnights, you will be charged at normal hotel rates. Land Only packages do not include airport-hotel transfers.

BAGGAGE: International flights to and from the USA allow the passenger to bring one (1) checked bag, which may have a maximum weight of 50 lbs., and maximum combined dimensions of 62 inches. Also, one (1) "carry-on" with maximum dimensions of 8"x12"x20" is permitted. Luggage on domestic flights will cost extra. Luggage is the passenger's responsible for notifying the airline directly.
