

Day by Day Itinerary

September 19 Day I: Departure: Depart to Montreal Quebec. Once we arrive, we check in into our Down Town hotel. Evening is at leisure.

September 20 Day 2: Montreal: Today we start with a visit to St. Joseph's Oratory which grew from a small chapel on beautiful Mount Royal to the premier Shrine dedicated to St. Joseph, and one of the world's most visited shrines. The basilica's huge dome reaches 97 meters and is second only in height to Saint Peter's basilica in Rome. The sheer size of it contrasts sharply with its frail founder, Brother André, the humble doorkeeper who had initiated its construction in 1904. The shrine consists of a primitive chapel, a votive chapel, a crypt and a basilica large enough to accommodate 10,000 worshippers. Relics of Brother André and many ex-voto of miraculously cured pilgrims are exhibited. The basilica's great organs and 52 bell chimes will occasionally rekindle solemn works of great composers. You have a tour of the Oratory and time for the Way of the Cross on the mountainside. Following Mass, you become acquainted with this cosmopolitan city, and its European flavor. See such sights as: BNP/Laurentian Bank Tower, the famous Mount Royal Hotel, Molson Centre the home of the Montreal Canadian Hockey team, Palais des Congress convention center, Place des Arts heart of Montreal's cultural life, Dorchester Square, Sainte Catherine Street, Old Montreal downtown shopping and commercial center.

Overnight Montreal (B)

September 21 Day 3: Montreal Start our day with a visit to Mary Queen of the World Cathedral, a scaled down replica of St Peter's Basilica in Rome. Continue on to Notre Dame Basilica, a masterpiece of Gothic Revival architecture, and one of the most beautiful churches in North America. We continue to the Shrine of Cap de la Madeleine, Canada's primary Shrine to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Notre-Dame-du-Cap Shrine is a marvelous shady park that surrounds a beautiful small stone church. This old church bears witness to three centuries of the religious life of people of Cap-de-la-Madeleine. Each year, 550,000 Christians worldwide join in a pilgrimage acknowledging the presence of the Virgin Mary in their life and ask her motherly protection. The Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate, who are in charge of this Shrine, have erected an impressive basilica whose lines are similar to the American Indian wigwams. You tour the Shrine, celebrate Mass, say the Rosary at the Bridge of Rosaries, see the Gardens of Our Lady and join in the Candlelight procession.

Overnight: Montreal (B)

September 22 Day 4: Depart Montreal for Québec City: This morning after breakfast, Stop at Shrine of Native American Saint Kateri Tekakwitha. Continue to Trois-Rivières to visit Canada's National Shrine to Our Blessed Mother. We visit the breathtaking Montmorency Falls for a picture stop. Upon arrival in Quebec City, the remainder of the day is spent visiting the beautiful Shrine of Sainte Anne De Beaupre. This is Canada's most famous Shrine and place of pilgrimage. Dedicated to St. Anne, by the Jesuit Fathers in 1657, the sanctuary is in a small village near St. Lawrence River. The stones of this beautiful church whisper to all who come here of the joys, happiness, hopes, fears, pain and suffering of all those who came before to place their prayers before the Lord, His Blessed Mother and His Grandmother. You have time to attend Mass at the Basilica, place your petition at the base of St. Anne's beautiful statue, attend Adoration and prayers for the sick, pray the Stations of the Cross or spend time in the Memorial Chapel. As an act of penance, many pilgrims go up the Holy Stairs on their knees. Tonight, we join in the Candlelight Procession.

Overnight Quebec City area. (B)

Friday September 23 Day 5: Quebec City Tour / Sail: This morning we head on a walking tour of Old Quebec City where we will enjoy the

charm of the French Settlement of North America. From the Latin Quarter to the plains of the famous Chateau Frontenac. Free time for lunch before we head to the Cathedral-Basilica of Notre-Dame de Québec. Here we Celebrate Mass. After a guided tour, we head to our ship and get ready for sailing. Overnight: Cruise Ship (B, D)

September 24 Day 6: At Sea – Today we enjoy a day on the ship to relax.

September 25 Day 7: Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island: You'll visit the Anne of Green Gables Museum and the old farm site that inspired Montgomery's first novel, Anne of Green Gables, published in 1908. Discover rolling farmland, stunning seascapes, tiny villages and bustling harbors as you travel along the scenic Central Coastal Drive. Settle in downtown Charlottetown for some free time to sample the local seafood!

Overnight: Cruise Ship (B, D)

September 26 Day 8: Sydney, Nova Scotia: The coal industry brought immigration from many parts of the world, giving Sydney a multicultural mix of over 50 ethnic backgrounds and a global flavor to its history. Located on Cape Breton Island, Sydney is also an ideal jumping-off point for scenic adventures. In our excursion, we step back in time to the 18th century to experience Louisbourg, a thriving seaport and capital of Cape Breton Island. The fortress is Canada's largest historical reconstruction, it has been meticulously rebuilt.

Overnight: Cruise Ship (B, D)

September 27 Day 8: Halifax, Nova Scotia: Admire the rugged coastline that surrounds Halifax, the world's second-largest natural harbor. This beautifully preserved city is Nova Scotia's capital and was founded in 1749. Take steps through history and climb to The Citadel to witness the Old Town Clock. Today we experience a narrated excursion of Halifax, driving by historic properties, the waterfront, Citadel Hill and the beautiful public gardens before heading out to charming Peggy's Cove where we'll have time to explore on our own.

Overnight: Cruise Ship (B, D)

September 28 Day 9: Portland Maine: Portland offers all the amenities of a big city: art districts, a vibrant waterfront, museums, parks and diverse shopping opportunities. But within minutes, you can be enjoying the view from an historic lighthouse or tasting a juicy, local lobster. To make the most of our day in Portland, this tour combines the city highlights with a visit to historic Portland Head Light and the charming seaside town of Kennebunkport.

Overnight: Cruise Ship (B, D)

September 29 Day 10: Bar Harbor, Maine: Today we take a tour of the best that Bar Harbor has to offer as we drive through the beautiful scenery of Acadia National Park and learn about the fascinating world of the lobster fisherman. We will journey along Park Loop Road along the ocean's edge passing Otter Cliff and Thunder Hole where the ocean swells converge against the granite cliffs to create a thunderous roar. At the end of our tour, we will return to explore Bar Harbor's many shops, boutiques and restaurants.

Overnight: Cruise Ship (B, D)

September 30 Day II: (Disembark) Boston, Massachusetts: Today we disembark from our cruise ship in Boston and go on a panoramic city tour before checking into our hotel. Afternoon at leisure, and a farewell dinner at our hotel.

Terms & Conditions

By making any payments (cash, credit card or otherwise) towards any tour constitutes your unconditional acceptance of all the terms and conditions stated in this brochure. Holy Land Travel Center shall be referred to as HLTC within this document.

DOCUMENTS: US citizens require a valid passport. Other nationalities please inquire with the appropriate embassies.

REGISTRATION AND DEPOSIT: Deposit of \$500 per person is required upon registration along with a signed copy of the registration form on or before. Registrations are processed in the order received by HLTC A second payment of \$1249 is required on or before 150 days prior to departure. A third payment of \$1000 is due 90 days prior to departure. Final payment is due 45 days prior to departure. Late payments are subject to \$50 late fee. HLTC reserves the right to cancel reservations that are not paid 30 days prior to departure and to apply applicable cancellation/penalties indicated below. No registrations can be made over the telephone.

INDIVIDUAL CANCELLATION FEES & REFUNDS: Upon cancellation of participation of tour by you, the registrant, for any reason, and only after HLTC receives your signed cancellation, HLTC will then refund your payment for services not received by you, minus applicable cancellation fees per person, according to the following schedule:

In addition to any cancellation fees specific to your tour found on your tour brochure, the following fees apply.

- 1) Minimum cancellation fee is \$350 from time of registration.
- 2) 180 days out from departure, the full deposit of \$500 is non-refundable.
- 3) From 119 to 60 days prior to departure day, the cancellation fee is \$350 + 30% of total price.
- 4) From 59 days to 8 days prior to departure day, cancellation fee is \$350 + 50% of total price.
- 5) From 7 days prior to departure day onward, no refund is possible.

TRAVEL PROTECTION: Travel insurance is recommended to help protect you and your trip investment against the unexpected. For your convenience, we offer travel protection. If you do not wish to purchase now, the plan can be purchased any time prior to departure date. If you chose to purchase outside of the time sensitive period outlined in the plan, you will not be eligible for time sensitive benefits. MEDICAL CONDITION: We endeavor to provide the highest level of service to all our passengers. Participants who require special assistance must be accompanied by a qualified helper who assumes total responsibility for the participants' well-being. This pilgrimage demands a lot of walking and can be strenuous. HLTC is not responsible for any medical conditions that occur prior to, during, or after the tour.

LAND TRANSPORTATION AND TRANSFERS: By private deluxe motor coach. ACCOMMODATIONS: Tour prices are per person, based on two persons sharing double or twin-bedded rooms with private bathroom with tub or shower. In the event that one does not sign up with a roommate and is not able to be paired with another traveler, there will be a single supplement charge to the account. Single rooms subject to availability and an additional cost of \$1200 based on inside cabin. Call for availability and current pricing.

MEALS: Meals in accordance with the itinerary. All beverages are extra.

TIPPING: Unless it is specified in the tour brochure, the price of the tour does not include tips and gratuities. Tipping is recommended to the tour guide and motor coach driver approximately \$6 and \$4 per person, respectively, per day to each: Hotel tips are approximately \$2 per day per person. AIRLINE TICKETS AND ITINERARY LENGTH: Air transportation to/from your destination will be economy class aboard carriers utilizing non-refundable, non-amenable tickets. Preliminary international flight schedules are available 60 days prior to departure and may change before they are finalized. Therefore, if you book

the domestic flight on your own, you will be responsible for changing your domestic flights and incurring any change fees that would be generated by this adjustment. We are not responsible for changes and delays in airline schedules and do not reimburse passengers for expenses resulting from such occurrences. Travelers making their own flight arrangements should not purchase non-refundable, non-changeable tickets. We cannot guarantee the most direct routing to your final destination. If flight schedules change, we reserve the right to lengthen or shorten the itinerary accordingly, and if changes or flight schedules necessitate extra overnights, you will be charged at normal hotel rates.
